- Discussion ensued regarding some offensive signs in Holiday Park and Officer Sicairos is going to check into if any action can be taken
- •Christie Bruner Healthy St. Pete
 - Christie provided the Healthy St Pete program's origination to help with community health disparities.
 - She explained the various programs and events that City department provides to their residents and that almost every city recreation center has something different to offer
 - This program collaborates with other local experts in health such as hospitals and dieticians
 - One of the programs is Get Fit St Pete, which provides fitness events, such as the neighborhood walks
 - Amy has volunteered to be the HPNA Wellness Champion and encouraged everyone to come out this Saturday for our neighborhood walk (separate flyer); also encouraged everyone to attend HPNA's 1st Annual Haunted Halloween Golf Cart Parade (separate flyer)
 - o Christie provided some flyers and giveaways to encourage both fitness and healthy eating
 - o Individuals and corporations can become Healthier Together Certified

Local Topic:

- •Jeff Wray our HPNA Council of Neighborhood Associations (CONA) representative
 - Reminded us that there are 7 amendments on the November 2nd election ballot and to please read the recommendations on the League of Women Voters website to see the pros/cons
 - \circ $\;$ Jeff expressed the need for more HPNA volunteers.
 - Provided a brief overview of the StPete 2050 plan, a citywide conversation about the future of St. Petersburg (Amy will email a copy of Jeff's PowerPoint to the email listserv):
 - The City wants to address future housing needs by increasing density through altering current zoning (Holiday Park is currently NS: Neighborhood Suburban) to allow for Auxillary Dwellings (Garage Apts, Mother-in-Law Suites) and Multi-Family Units from 2-30 units per lot.
 - The plan also wants to address future traffic flow and anticipated patterns and has identified 30th Ave. North as a Future Major Street.
 - City Council's Land Use and Transportation Committee voted on 10/14 for city-wide implementation of multi-family housing, up to 4 families per lot.
 - HPNA (Jeff and Amy) have sent letters to District 1 Councilman, Robert Blackmon, for clarification on vote implications.

Derek Kilborn Manager, Urban Planning and Historic Preservation Division and Liz Abernethy, Director of Planning And Development Services to discuss StPete2050 plans.
